## Isn't Christianity for Old People?

Origins: Tough Questions, Real Answers

Texts: (Genesis 4:1-7) Deuteronomy 6:4-25

Genesis 4 introduces us to the first, 2<sup>nd</sup> generation of a family, and already there are some resisting following God and some choosing to follow God. What can we learn from the broader context of the Torah about passing genuine faith to the next generations?

Deuteronomy 6:4-6 – Pursue and pass on a wholistic faith in Jesus

• Spend quality time with the Lord yourself, engaging your mind, body, and heart.

Deuteronomy 6:7a – Talk about Jesus often

• YouVersion Bible studies together, reading a kids Bible to little ones (We recommend The Jesus Storybook Bible); Develop verses that you memorize and recite regularly together (situation specific); Share what you are learning about Jesus; Talk about how you see Jesus working in other people's lives

Deuteronomy 6:7b – Talk about Jesus in the natural flow of life

 Ask questions about what Jesus' teachings say about daily life situations; Look for teachable moments in everyday life situations.

Deuteronomy 6:8-9 - Keep the teachings of Jesus visible and tactile

• Notes in lunches; pictures/quotes/verses around the house; Play worship music in the background

Deuteronomy 6:10-12 – Teach them gratitude

• Use mealtimes to talk about how you have seen God provide; Invite them to participate in giving

Deuteronomy 6:14-15 - Identify and discuss the gods of our culture

• As good journalist questions (who, what, where, when, why, and how); Discuss the messaging you see in the media and in stores

Deuteronomy 6:20-25 – Teach them the Gospel

• Talk about your faith journey (How you came to faith in Jesus, how your life is different, what God is teaching you); Talk about the difference between the good news of Jesus and religion or moralism; Talk about why you do what you do (motivation is an important distinction)
