Origins: Tough Questions, Real Answers

Text: Genesis 2:15-17; 3:1-6

<u>The Tree:</u> Tov – Good Ra – Bad (which can lead to and include evil) – Jeremiah 24:1-2; Psalm 140:1

The tree represents a choice about two different ways of approaching life: 1) Will I allow God to define and guide me in what is good vs. bad?

2) Will I define it myself and pursue my own path?

<u>The serpent:</u> Cunning, shrewd, crafty (Genesis 3:1) The Tempter (Matthew 16:1); Deceiver (Revelation 12:9) Accuser (Revelation 12:10); Father of lies & murderer (John 8:43-45)

The strategy of Satan:

- Question the word of God (Genesis 3:1 compared with 2:16)
 - Often by twisting the words of God (see Matthew 4:1-11)
 - Often by including some portion of truth
- Question the character of God (Genesis 3:4-5)
 - Question God's trustworthiness (Genesis 3:4)
 - Question God's intent (Genesis 3:5)
- Entertain & Rationalize Sin (Genesis 3:6; James 1:13-15)

<u>The protection Jesus-focused community brings</u> Genesis 3:6 (negative example) vs. Hebrews 10:10-24

*What is keeping me from joining a life group to find the kind of community that helps me stay rooted and flourishing in the ways of Jesus?
