Origins: Tough Questions, Real Answers

Text: Genesis 2:15-17; 3:1-21

The brokenness of our world and what we feel within tells us that things are not as they should be.

The Nature of Sin:

- Rejection of and rebellion against God's ways
- Following anything or anyone we place in the position of God
- Sin promises wholeness but leaves us disintegrated.
- Sin breaks and corrupts the shalom that God originally designed for our flourishing in relationship with Him, ourselves, others, and this world.

The Human Reaction to Sin:

- Shame & Guilt (Genesis 3:7a compared to Genesis 2:25)
- Covering (Genesis 3:7b)
- Hiding (Genesis 3:8)
- Arrogance and blame shifting (Genesis 3:12-13)

Questions for Reflection:

- How am I trying to cover myself from the sin in my life and the sin done against me?
- How do I hide/am I hiding? (i.e. What is my MO to deal with my own sin or the sins of others against me?)
- What lies am I believing that lead me into hiding?
- Where/How am I refusing to take responsibility for my sin?

The Path from Sin to Freedom:

- Hear God's invitation to step out of hiding into a healing, restorative relationship with Him (Genesis 3:9-11)
- Taking responsibility for your actions (Genesis 3:11-13).
- Receive the forgiveness and covering that only God has provided for you in Jesus (Genesis 3:21; 2 Corinthians 5:17-21)
